

# Conrad Grünenberg's Wappenbuch

Corrections and amendments to the edition of 2009

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Since the publication of my edition of the *Grünenberg* in 2009 further reprints of the 1875 facsimile by Stillfried-Alcantara & Hildebrand have been published, e.g. one by Verlag Degener in 2011 and one by Edizioni Orzini de Marzo, also in 2011. The latter is accompanied by an excellent edition (in french) by Michel Popoff, former conservateur-en-chef at the Bibliothèque nationale de France and President of the Academie Internationale de Héraldique, and includes an introduction by professor Michel Pastoureau.

The Popoff edition is highly recommended. The numeration follows the pages of the facsimile of the facsimile and includes an item-by-item concordance with my edition for ease of reference (see the files: *GRU\_concord-on-BSB.pdf* and *GRU\_concord-on-Stillfried.pdf*). As the editions were compiled independently several comments and references differ as do some identifications.

As my research into the german armorials have progressed further information on a number of families and coats-of-arms have come available, and the 117 changes in the 2316 items including the more significant points made by Michel Popoff have been incorporated into the *corrections* paper given below.

As the Stillfried-facsimile omitted several pages from the GStA-manuscript, the numeration of the Popoff/Stillfried-edition, the GStA-manuscript and my edition differs, which might cause some confusion, but was unavoidable. The missing pages are easily found in the BSB-concordance. In the present file, my (BSB) numbering and pagination is on the top left of the item, with the Popoff numbering below and my GStA numbering on the right. The pagination in the Popoff/Stillfried-edition follows the GStA-manuscript. Due to the database used for my edition, there are an 8000-series for unnumbered items in the GStA and a 9000-series for unnumbered BSB-items.

It was later united with the duchy of Liegnitz, and most likely vassals of the king of Böhmen. Ludwig (I) Hz.Brieg, 1313-1398, was grandfather of Philippe 'bon' D.Bourgogne. The shield is enclosed by the chain and pendant of the Order of the Rügenband instituted by Ludwig (II), d.1436.

In the partition of 1295 Pommern-Wolgast got northern Vorpommern, Rügen in 1325, Usedom, Kamminer Land, and Stolp. Wartislaw was a distant cousin of Erik king of Danmark-Norge-Sverige. Pommern impaling Putbus, though the giffin isst ought to be an eagle isst. In vs.H with Putbus only. The Putbus or Podebusk was ancient princes of the island of Rügen.

 The BGf.Hartenstein, a saxon, has {Or saltire Sa & border compony Ar-Gu} in UFF:456; MIL:1283; and DWF:149 with a different crest. Burg Hartenstein nr Zwickau was built c.1170 by Meinhard von Werben. It was sold by the BGf.Meissen, a relative (arms in [115]), to Gf.Schömburg in 1406.

 The bird might be a crane or heron.

Bernhard (II) Gf.Wölpe, 1176-1221, present Teilort Wölpe in Nienburg a.d. Weser (Kr. Nienburg, Nsx). He married Sophie von Dassel. His seal of 1215 has 5 shields for Wölpe + Otto IV + Braunschweig + Dassel + Schweinfurt (Rabbow, Kleeblatt 2010 p.33).
